OUR PROGRAMS

San Francisco Emergency Rental Assistance - SF ERAP

This program is funded by the San Francisco
Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing
(HSH) and the Mayor's Office of Housing &
Community Development (MOHCD). The Program
aims to prevent households from experiencing
homelessness and being displaced. To accomplish
this, SF ERAP provides financial assistance to San
Francisco residents at high risk of homelessness or
housing loss who have past-due rent; cannot afford
move-in costs; and/or need assistance with future
rent to maintain their housing.

Program Eligibility is determined by the City. Requirements

- a. San Francisco Resident
- b. Below the program's income limit for your household size
- c. At high risk of losing your housing or becoming homeless
- d. Able to demonstrate recent financial hardship.

Types of Assistance provided:

- Back Rent/Future Rent Assistance
- Move-in Assistance
- Utilities Assistance

Housing Assistance for Ukrainians Program -HAU

The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) Refugee Programs Bureau (RPB) developed the Housing Assistance for Ukrainians (HAU) Program to support the transition of recent Ukrainian newcomers to long-term housing in California. The HAU will provide direct housing and utility assistance and housing support services to eligible households through partnerships with refugee-impacted counties.

Documents required

- a. Forms of identification
- b. Documents related to your immigration to the U.S.
- c. Lease agreement with aplicant's name written down or other proof of residence.
- d. Utility bills
- e. Contact details of the landlord/agency.

Types of Assistance provided:

- Back Rent
- Move-in Assistance
- Utilities Assistance
- Social services/ Resources and referrals.

Eligibility: Individuals paroled into the U.S. between february 24, 2022 and september 30, 2023. UHPs who came to the U.S. independtly. Parolees processed under the U.S. citizenship and immigration services program, Uniting for Ukraine (U4U).
